



OUTCOME OF THE 6-DAY (30 HOURS) ADD ON COURSE ON PUBLIC POLICY: NATURE & DIMENSIONS (18TH MARCH – 23RD MARCH)\

The 6-day Add-On Course on "Public Policy: Nature and Dimension," held from 18th to 23rd March 2024, was successfully conducted at our college premises. The program brought together 16 distinguished resource persons and 60 enthusiastic students from our college and other institutions.
